DAYS 1-3:

Arrival in Ghana and Accra City Tours

Visit Independence Square in Accra, where Ghanaians celebrate Independence Day, and stand beneath the Black Star Square, a monument honoring Ghana's Black Star and Marcus Garvey, adopted by Dr. Kwame Nkrumah.

Visit the Kwame Nkrumah Mausoleum, which is the final resting place of the first President of Ghana and one of Africa's most renowned Statesmen and Pan-Africanists.



Visit the W.E.B. DuBois Memorial Center for Pan-African Culture, which is a research library and gallery containing the invaluable manuscripts of Dr. W.E.B. DuBois.

We will drive through the commercial districts of Accra and see the amazing development and growth of Accra; and stop at points of interest as we crisscross through Accra, one of the most vibrant and exciting cities in Africa.



Celebrate Juneteenth in Ghana

June 19th 1865, marked the end of slavery in the United States. Juneteenth is a time to reflect on our past while we celebrate our achievement and hope for better to come.

Ghana's annual Juneteenth Parade and Festival hosted by the African American Association of Ghana (AAAG), commemorates this historic event and emphasizes the inextricable link between African Americans and the motherland, Africa.



The celebration features music, dance, poetry, and open dialogues highlighting shared heritage. It has become a symbolic event for reconnecting with African roots and fostering diaspora engagement.



Our Juneteenth Celebration in Ghana will be a day to remember.



We will end the day with a buffet dinner with cultural dancing and drumming performances; and a DJ playing your favorite dance tunes.

DAYS 4-6:

We Tour Kumasi, and its Surrounding Towns

In Kumasi, tour members will have the opportunity to explore the capital city of the ancient Asante Kingdom and its surrounding towns and villages.

Visit Manhyia Palace, the traditional home of the Asantehene "the king of kings," the king of all the Asante.

While at Manhyia Palace, visit the Museum, which is filled with countless relics and artifacts that highlight the richness of the history and culture of the Asante people.



Stop for photos at the Okomfo Anokye Monument, dedicated to the traditional priest who "conjured" from the skies the famous Golden Stool that unified the Asante people.



Have lunch at Ike's Café, on the grounds of the National Center for Culture in Kumasi.

This well-known restaurant is located on its own "lake" and is famous for its fresh fish, which tour members can select live from Ike's "point and kill" tank.



Traditional Naming Ceremony

Participate in a Traditional Naming Ceremony, where you will be given a traditional Asante name based on your day of birth and welcomed into your "adopted" family with dance and celebration.



Visit the woodcarving village of Ahwiaa where you will see craftsmen carving wood masterpieces; and Adanwomase, one of the most popular kente weaving villages.



DAYS 7-8:

We Tour the Central Region

Wade in the water at "Slave River"

On the way to Elmina, we will stop at Assin Manso to take part in a Ceremony of Remembrance at the "Slave River", where our ancestors were made to bathe after their long and grueling march to the coast of Ghana, which could have lasted up to six months.



Visit Elmina and Cape Coast Slave Dungeons

Tour Elmina and Cape Coast Slave Dungeons, infamous as the places where the largest number of enslaved Africans were housed before shipment to the Americas.



We will return in time for you to relax and enjoy one of Ghana's most beautiful beaches.



In the evening, we will have our Departure Dinner, which will include cultural performances and a DJ playing your favorite dance tunes.



DAY 9:

Travel to Accra and enjoy a free afternoon

After your breakfast, we will depart for Accra. We will get to Accra with free time in the afternoon for you to have time for shopping, spa treatments; or you can relax, enjoy the hotel amenities; or if you choose, do nothing at all!



DAY 10:


Depart to the US
